## Introduction

$\longrightarrow$ Written in 1595/96
$\longrightarrow$ One of Shakespeare's most popular works


## Summary - Part (1)

$\longrightarrow$ Theseus is preparing for his marriage to Hippolyta,
$\longrightarrow$ Theseus tells Hermia to obey her father and marry Demetrius . If she doesn't, the options will be to die or to be ordained.
$\rightarrow$ But Hermia loves Lysander so the lovers run away from Athens and get lost in the woods.


## Summary - Part (2)


$\longrightarrow$ Oberon quarrelled with Titania;
$\longrightarrow$ Oberon sends Puck to get a love-potion flower to take revenge on Titania;
$\longrightarrow$ But Puck puts the flower juice on the eyes of Lysander, too, so he falls in love with Helena, who is actually in love with Demetrius.

## Summary - Part (3)

$\longrightarrow$ Some artisans are rehearsing a play about the tragic love-story of Pyramus and Thisbe to be performed at Theseus wedding.
$\longrightarrow$ Puck plays a trick on them by giving Bottom an asinine head.
$\longrightarrow$ Oberon pours on Titania's eyes the flower juice but she falls in love with Bottom, the donkey-
 headed.

## Summary - Part (4)

$\longrightarrow$ Then Puck removes the asinine head from Bottom
$\longrightarrow$ Oberon pours the magic juice on Demetrius's eyes and Puck does the same on Lysander's.
$\longrightarrow$ Order is restored and the three couples marry happily ever after.
$\longrightarrow$ Puck and the fairies bless the palace and its people.

Hippolyta $\rightarrow$ The queen of the Amazons.
egeus $\rightarrow$ Hermia's father
Puck or Robin Goodfellow $\rightarrow$ A mischievous sprite.
Hermia $\rightarrow$ Egeus's daughter.
bysander $\rightarrow$ A young nobleman of Athens in love with Hermia.
Demetrius $\rightarrow$ A young nobleman of Athens.
Helena $\rightarrow$ A young woman of Athens in love with Demetrius.
Oberon $\rightarrow$ The king of fairies.
Titania $\rightarrow$ The beautiful queen of fairies.
Nick Bottom $\rightarrow$ The weaver chosen to play Pyramus.
Peter Quince $\rightarrow$ A carpenter and the director of the craftsmen's play.

- Francis flute $\rightarrow$ The bellows-mender who plays Thisbe.
